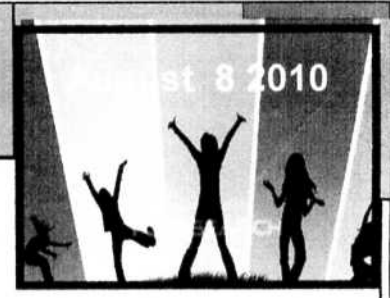
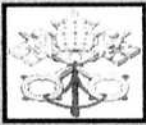

**"I know my body's Mine!"**

A good way to explain the difference between appropriate and inappropriate touching is—that the bad touch makes people feel uncomfortable. Kids should always tell their parents or a trusted adult when they feel uncomfortable.










**Understanding Good Touching vs. Bad Touching:**  
Explain the difference between good touching, such as hand holding, hugging, or a parent changing a child's diaper. Explain bad touching, such as hitting, kicking, touching parts of your body that a swimsuit covers.

**Don't keep secrets!** Teach your child to always tell you or a trusted adult if he or she has been encouraged to keep a secret. Help your child know that you won't be angry or upset, even if your child feels he's or she's done something wrong.

**Your child has the right to say, "No!"** They must be allowed set the limits. They have the right to stop unwanted touching or teasing. "Children have a natural sense of appropriate and inappropriate touching."
